Agriculture Inventory Project

Background

The purpose of the agricultural inventory project is to assist the Battle River Alliance for Economic Development (BRAED) task team to identify and promote to area residents new economic opportunities in the agriculture, agri-food and agri-products industries. The information provided in the agricultural inventory project will be supplemented with a strategic plan that when implemented will support the agricultural industry in the BRAED region.

Arable land consisting of 2,111,614.6 hectares (5,217,892 acres) allows for a diverse richness in the agricultural products produced and processed. With 4,557 farms of an average size of 516.6 hectares (1,276.3 acres) cattle, other livestock, grain and oilseed production are the dominant agricultural activities within the BRAED region.

Raw products range from grains and pulses to livestock producers, other animal breeders and fish hatcheries. Value added products include seed cleaning plants, feed mills, honey and meat processing to greenhouse operators.

BRAED area producers have good reason to be proud of their commitment to agriculture. With on-going efforts to improve their operations by implementing national and internationally recognized safety programs, quality control measures to ensure compliance for organic products, to winning awards the producers and processors are truly professionals in their fields.

Approach to Research

The approach taken to develop the agriculture inventory was to research each BRAED community on AlbertaFirst.com, review each community's business directory, research government and producer association/organization web sites for membership lists.

Government sources include Alberta Agriculture and Rural Development, Statistics Canada and related web sites such as Alberta Food Processors Association and Alberta Farm Fresh Producers Association. Association and organization web sources include livestock breeders' associations, organic producers and industry business listings.

Statistics Canada 2006 'Farms Classified by Industry' report for Alberta counties and municipal districts reported that there are 36 dairy cattle and milk producers and 1,622 beef cattle ranching and farms including feedlots in the BRAED area. Special Area No. 4 excepted since only the village of Consort within that rural area is a BRAED member. The report does not identify all 1,622 beef cattle ranchers within the geographic scope of the project, rather it

identifies those producers whom are members of their respective associations which publish a member directory.

Producers and processors who are members of their respective organizations which openly promote their members are fairly represented in this inventory report; non – member producers may be missed due to the vast number of operators who work independently who may not join or register with any organization. Producers not promoted by their respective associations have been identified through their affiliations with organizations promoting organic production or culinary tourism, for example.

Many producer groups such as the poultry, dairy, elk and pork associations do not publish their membership list. Assistance was requested from the association management in providing as much general information relative to the BRAED area as possible. General information and oftentimes the geographical location for these producer groups in these categories was obtained from numerous other sources when cross referenced with a multitude of websites.

Businesses supplying services and retail to the agricultural community are generally not included in this inventory. Examples of these types of services would be custom seeding services, retail sales of feed, fertilizer, and chemicals.

All agricultural societies were contacted to obtain current local information regarding local farmers' markets and other initiatives. The information provided has been included in the main body of the report. Agricultural field personnel in the counties and municipal districts were contacted as well for specific local information.

The information gathered was then followed up with telecom contact for clarification.

The presentation of the inventory is presented by counties and municipal districts because all of the producers have mailing addresses in a town or village including communities which are not BRAED members but again the operation is actually located within the rural area either in a county or municipal district. Businesses physically located within non BRAED villages and towns have been excluded from this inventory.

The village of Consort presents a unique situation in that it is the only BRAED member within Special Area No 4. The same methodology was used for this community, however, all producers and processors showing Consort as the mailing address were included to indicate that these businesses are members of the Consort business community. Agricultural producers and related businesses in municipalities other than Consort within Special Area No. 4 are not included in the inventory.

Each county or municipal district is further categorized by highlighting the hamlet, village and town in an alphabetical order with each producer and processor in that particular community then recorded in a similar fashion. Producers and processors in the BRAED region are members of numerous organizations and associations and it is only appropriate that these organizations and associations be introduced to the reader prior to the main body of the report.

Organizations and Producer Groups

Alberta Farm Fresh Producers Association – membership is voluntary in this non profit organization representing direct market growers. Most growers market directly to consumers via u-pick farms, farm gate and/or through farmers' markets. AFFPA is dedicated to supporting the production of farm direct market vegetable crops, berries and fruits, bedding plants, perennials, herbs, flowers, meats, poultry, eggs and other specialty items in Alberta.

'Verified Beef Producers' (VBP) – is Canada's verified on-farm food safety program for beef – a dynamic program to uphold consumer confidence in the products and good practices of this country's beef producers. The program is grass-roots driven and industry led. It is based on the principles of an international quality control program used widely in many industries, called Hazard Analysis Critical Control Points (HACCP), which has been specifically adapted for VBP. VBP is recognized by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency.

Prairie Heritage Beef (PHB) – a partnership of eco-committed ranch families that work together to sustainably produce and market beef; connecting the ranch gates to the consumer plate. These western Canadian cattle producers market 'natural' beef produced without antibiotics, growth hormones, or animal-by-products. PHB is currently undergoing the Food Alliance certification process.

Food Alliance – a non profit organization that certifies farms, ranches and food handlers for sustainable agriculture and facility management practices. It creates market incentives for socially and environmentally responsible agricultural practices and educates business leaders and other food system stakeholders on the benefits of sustainable agriculture.

Alberta AgFood Alliance - raises global awareness of Alberta products and services. Members gain access to up-to-date market intelligence, business leads and global contacts by participating in on-line discussion groups. Alberta AgFood Alliance was implemented by Alberta Agriculture and Rural Development in conjunction with InfoHarvest Inc.

United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)

Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA). Federal registration is required for processors wishing to market food products inter provincially. In June 2009 a CFIA enforced standard was introduced for the organic industry. It will be on par with the USDA (NOP) National Organic Program. All organic produce crossing provincial boundaries are required to be certified ISO 65 compliant.

Global Organic Alliance, Inc. – maintains ISO 65 and USDA accreditation and verifies compliance to EEC 2092/91 Regulation. GOA is also authorized to issue TM-11Export Certificates to Japan.

Quality Management International Inc. – QMI is an international accredited organic certifying body. With trained inspectors and a certification committee of experts in the organic industry, they are accredited to certify crop, livestock and handling operations. QMI can certify

operations including farm and forage land, forage, livestock, poultry, dairy, horticulture, seed cleaning and transportation & storage facilities.

Organic Crop Improvement Association International (OCIA). OCIA is a non profit, member owned organization committed to providing its members with the highest quality organic certification, research and education services, as well as access to the global organic market. It is the certifying body for AOPA.

Alberta Organic Producers Association (AOPA) certification — OCIA Alberta Chapter #1

Canadian Seed Institute (CSI) – CSI is accredited by CFIA to deliver the bulk storage facility (BSF) program. BSF's can handle, store, sell, and label seed with a Canadian pedigreed grade name and the variety name.

Canadian Seed Growers Association – all of the seed producers identified in the following report are members of CSGA. CSGA is ISO 9001:2000 registered.

Alberta Approved Farmers' Market Association (AAFMA) – this organization is at the heart of the local food movement in Alberta. Members must meet minimum guidelines established by Alberta Agriculture and Rural Development

Slow Food – is a grassroots response to the expanding fast food industry. Founded in 1998 it's aim is to build public awareness of local farmers' products and acknowledging the restaurants and processors who support them. Today there are 100,000 members in 132 countries. Alberta Agriculture's '*Dine Alberta*', a program dedicated to connecting restaurant chefs with producers and putting more Alberta grown fare on restaurant plates has partnered with Travel Alberta and Slow Food Calgary in promoting this trend as 'culinary tourism'. Edmonton also promotes 'Slow Food' events.

Alberta Regional Cuisine Sourcing Directory – a directory for products and producers that have partnered with chefs creating the '*Dine Alberta*' experience.

Keep Edmonton Original – an organization about supporting and sustaining independent business as a fixture of the local culture and community.

Seedy Saturday – is a worldwide celebration of open pollinated seeds. To counter large commercial seed companies that consolidate and only offer hybrids and patented varieties. It is committed to maintaining plant diversity and healthy gardens.

Alberta Rhodiola Rosea Growers Association (ARRGO) – provides its members with a single stop support organization for the production and sale of high quality herbal products based on rhodiola rosea. ARRGO only processes rhodiola rosea from growers who are certified under the Good Agricultural Collection Practices (GACP) certification program and documents the identity and traceability of plants through their lifecycle. Every crop is laboratory tested prior to processing and delivery to customers.

Beaver County

Hutterite Colonies

Bruce - Iron Creek Colony – Fresh eggs, beef and pork. The animals are growth hormone/chemical free. The Colony has an on site provincially inspected beef/pork processing facility. They also produce their own bacon and sausage for sale at the farm gate. Eggs (have 2,600 + layers) get shipped to a Calgary area egg grading station. They do not sell any product at farmers’ markets. However, they retail their beef and pork at the Smokin’ Iron Farms meat and deli store in Edmonton.

Holden Hutterite Colony – offers seasonal vegetables, on site greenhouse offers tomatoes, cucumbers and peppers year round), chicken, saskatoons and honey. Value added products include goose down pillows and bedding and leather gloves. Sales on site and at Farmers’

Business Opportunities For BRAED Producers

Several business opportunities have been identified for BRAED agricultural producers. These are only conceptual ideas therefore economic viability has not been determined.

Culinary tourism – promote BRAED products to Slow Food Edmonton and Slow Food Calgary. Support and encourage local producers to supply local dining establishments to list with Alberta Agriculture's 'Dine Alberta' program and encourage area producers to list their products with the 'Alberta Regional Cuisine Sourcing Directory'.

A 'culinary circle tour' could be developed within BRAED or in partnership with Central Alberta Economic Partnership (CAEP) to include producers and value added manufacturers in the respective regions to promote agricultural tourism and increase market share for area producers. The tours could include tours of Camrose processors as well as touring several of the organic and natural producers. The tour may include dining on local cuisine at various locations.

Opportunity for increased revenues may be accomplished by securing additional value chain opportunities for BRAED producers. For example, currently no one in the BRAED area is supplying bison to Carmen Creek Gourmet Meats Inc. based in Calgary. This marketer and distributor of a variety of additive and growth promotant free branded gourmet bison products supplies 218 Safeway stores, and Moxies restaurant chain just this year added Carmen Creek's product to its menu selection.

Shochu Barley – Applied research during 2008 was undertaken near Killam. The AC Metcalfe is a familiar barley variety with the right kernel hardness, starch content and quality for pearling that makes it an acceptable product for shochu, a popular distilled beverage in Japan. This crop may be an opportunity for 50 – 100 growers province wide. In 2008 Alberta shipped 50,000 tonnes to Japan which could increase to 60,000 tonnes by 2013.

Lupin – are member of the legume family. Newly bred variants of sweet lupin lack any bitter taste and require no soaking in salt solution. The seeds are used for different foods from vegan sausages to lupin-tofu or baking enhancing lupin flour. Given that lupin seeds have the full range of essential amino acids and that, contrary to soy, can be grown in more temperate to cool climates, lupins are becoming increasingly recognized as a cash crop alternative to soy.

Industrial Hemp - Hemp has many industrial uses. The Alberta Research Council is experimenting on the use of hemp composite for car bodies. There will be a demonstration of such a vehicle at the 2010 Olympics in Vancouver, BC.

Bio-fuels – the Canadian government has mandated a 5% bio-fuel content in all motor vehicle fuel by 2010. It is estimated to increase demand to 3 billion litres per year. What is not produced in Canada will need to be imported. Besides wheat, which is currently used in Alberta for ethanol production, consideration may be given to industrial hemp.

- Industrial hemp production – As a biofuel *cannabis sativa* and its related species provide denser cellulose content than does corn, higher sugar content and derives higher ethanol per metric tonne at lower costs. Alberta based ethanol plants are using wheat as a feedstock. Using hemp as the feedstock could mitigate producer fear considering that beef, pork and poultry producers all feed their animals the same grains that is required for ethanol production.

- Manure based power generation – a number of opportunities can also be met when partnering a biomass boiler or anaerobic digester with an existing animal feed operation and an ethanol plant. This could be explored utilizing new generation cooperative funding opportunities.

Business Challenges

Struggling U.S. livestock producers hit hard by the recent economic downturn and the drop in demand for meat in the United States have spurred trade protectionism measures, including country of origin regulations (COOL), that essentially require U.S. meat processors to segregate live Canadian cattle and hogs from U.S. animals. Furthermore, any packaged Canadian meat must be labelled as such – this separate labelling is costly for U.S. processors and are unwilling to accept Canadian animals. COOL has resulted in a tightened, protectionist border. For example, Canadian hog exports to the U.S. for market pigs has dropped to 585,000 pigs from January through June. That compares to 1.4 million for the same period a year earlier, a 60% drop.

Canadian livestock producers have been hit hard by high feed-grain prices driven by U.S. ethanol policy, weak livestock prices, a high Canadian dollar, mad cow disease-related border closures for cattle, and H1N1- related border closures for pork to some countries and now COOL.
